1) Advanced Supply Chain Management 1

The aim of the course is to achieve an understanding and knowledge about the supply chain, its participants, functions and flows and how these are interrelated and interacting. It introduces the students to how to analyze logistic flows for different products and services within and between firms in the supply chain.
