I have had a large number of assignments around the world as examiner, organizer of conferences and workshops, conference organizer, ad hoc reviewer for journals, publishers and grant foundations; work for government agencies and peak bodies, and consulted for commercial organizations.

Teaching

Although I have for most of my career held positions heavier on research than on teaching I have in all done the equivalent of several years of full time lecturing. I have additional pedagogical experience from teaching at primary school; approx. 1100 hours in class during the 1978-1981 period. I have considerable experience of curriculum development on bachelor, masters and doctoral levels. I have also written teaching cases and other educational material (see entries "research vignettes", "sketchbook videos" and "teaching materials" in 'list of publications' below).

A fair assessment of my qualities as a teacher is probably that I do very well with Ph.D. students, MBAs and executives, where the participants can give more intellectual and experience-based input to a fruitful, interactive learning experience. With undergraduates I reach well above average, but not award-winning status. The evaluations tend to say that they appreciate this professor's knowledge of his subject matter, but in this type of group I do not score as highly on entertainment value.

From Jan. 2010- June 2018 I was the (founding) Director of the Australian Centre for Entrepreneurship Research.

In 2010/11 I was the elected chair of the 2,700 member strong Entrepreneurship Division (ENT) of the Academy of Management. This was part of a 5-year participation in the ENT leadership team.

2007-2009 I was Assistant Dean (Research) for the Faculty of Business and QUT, Australia.

During 2006-7 I initiated and built the faculty-wide "Entrepreneurship & Innovation Cluster" (www.bus.qut.edu.au/research/acbr/eirp), from scratch to a research group with 40+ members and affiliates.

2004-7 I was Research Director at the Brisbane Graduate School of Business, QUT, Australia.

The above positions entail all aspects of research leadership such as developing strategies, benchmarks and incentives; establishing mechanisms for initiation and development of research grant applications and journal publications; development of enrolment criteria; curriculum; milestones and supervisory support structure for research students, etc.

July 2002-June 2004 I was Head of the Department for Entrepreneurship, Marketing and Management (EMM) at JIBS. This involved managerial responsibility for a unit with over 40 people as regards recruiting, coaching and "cultivation" of people as well as financial management, although some aspects of the latter has not been my responsibility (e.g., salary setting). I also held this position temporarily in 1995 for six months during a colleague's sabbatical.

During 1998-2001 I was program director/research leader for a major, international-collaborative research program, the Program on Entrepreneurship and Growth in SMEs (PEG). This assignment involved management of an activity involving more than twenty people; recruiting and delegating responsibilities to these people, budgetary/financial responsibilities, arranging meetings and international visits, deciding on internal 'applications', etc.

I effectively functioned as full professor with all the administrative duties that follow that position since I was first recruited to JIBS in 1994, although the formal appointment as full professor came in 1996. Within the school, I was 'Subject Area Manager' for the Entrepreneurship sub-discipline during all of this time. Holding a professorship in a small and growing school also means actively serving on various committees, boards and work-groups internally.
