- understand the impact of childhood disability on participation for children and their families
- understand the personal and environmental factors, including social and socio-political influences on participation
- understand the theoretical principles and empirical evidence for intervention efficacy to improve participation outcomes.

Skills and abilities

- discuss the family of participation related constructs
- identify and use measures of participation for applications within clinical practice
- design interventions that address participation as a product or a process.
