## Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

Knowledge and understanding

- · describe children's biopsychosocial development
- · describe health and failing health in children and its impact on families
- · identify signs that indicate that children are at risk of harm
- describe children's need of nursing when in failing health in relation to co-production nursing in children and families.
