Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

Upon completion of the course students should have the ability to:

Knowledge and understanding

- describe basic and common problems for persons with post-traumatic stress (PTS) as a consequence of war and/or armed conflict, including torture
- identify occupational problems for persons with PTS and relate them to occupational therapy theory.

Skills and abilities

- relate basic occupational therapy methods to uncover issues regarding occupation and participation for persons with PTS
- assess how occupations can be used in preventive and health-promoting work with persons with PTS.

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate awareness of one's own approach in relation to other people with a human rights perspective
- reflect on and identify one's own need for development regarding the future profession.
