Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

After completing the course the student will be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- problematize theoretical fundamentals in underlying theories of person centered care and family focused nursing
- account for experiences and meaning of person centered care and family focused nursing in care of older people
- account for the use of relevant forms of conversation to illuminate health related problems while considering the needs of the older person, their carers and family.

Skills and abilities

- hold conversations aiming at identifying what is significant for the older person and reflect upon how this can be incorporated in the care planning of the older person
- hold conversations aiming at identifying family carers needs and resources and reflect upon these in care planning of the older person
- hold conversations aiming at raising family awareness of the significance of reciprocal influences for family wellbeing and function
- in conversations, support the older person and their family's learning and managing of identified problems and resources.

Judgement and approach

- assess and reflect on participation and partnership in care of the older person and their family
- in relation to course content reflect on the use of developed knowledge and ability in one's own caring practice in care of older people.

Type of instruction

The teaching is based on the principles of problembased thinking with active knowledge seeking, and an integrated learning. The teacherled instruction consists of recorded lectures, group work and seminars.

The teaching is normally conducted in Swedish, but can occasionally be in English.

Prerequisites

General entry requirements including Degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing or Degree of Bachelor of Science in Caring Science or equivalent.

Examination and grades

The course is graded Fail (U) or Pass (G).

To receive a passing grade the expected study results has to be achieved.

For the final course grade Pass both examination assignment 1 and 2 has to be graded Pass. Grade criteria is listed for each of the examination assignments and form the basis for grading.If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

Repeated examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University.
