Upon completion of the course students should have the ability to:

Knowledge and understanding

- describe chronic pain from a biopsychosocial perspective
- understand personal and environmental factors' significance to activity and participation.

Skills and abilities

- identify and describe pain in relation to activity and participation
- identify and describe factors that affect pain and pain behaviour.

Judgement and approach

• critically review and evaluate one's own knowledge gathering in the course's area of knowledge and identify what needs to be improved/developed.

Contents

- biopsychosocial model for pain
- pain behaviour and health
- pain's impact on activity and participation

Type of instruction

The course is implemented through a distance course online in the form of recorded lectures and self study.

The teaching is normally conducted in Swedish, but can occasionally be in English.

Prerequisites

General entry requirements and completion of courses equivalent to 60 credits from the courses Occupational therapy in profession and research, 30 credits, Activity and development throughout life, 30 credits and/or Occupational Therapy for Activity Limitations in Disability and Disease, 30 credits (or the equivalent).

A university lecturer serves as examiner for the course.
