1) Advanced Leadership

The course builds on a set of theoretical perspectives about leadership covering key themes from sociology and psychology such as power, identity, strategy, change, crisis, gender and ethics in order to foster professional and personal responsibilities as a leader in a global context.

The examiner and core teacher is Associate Professor Daniel Pittino (myself); the course team is completed by the colleagues Jean Charles Languilaire, Ayesha Manzoor and Markus Plate.
