Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

The student shall meet the following learning outcomes, which cover knowledge and understanding, skills and abilities as well as judgement and approach. On completion of the course, the student should be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of a structured and systematic approach to the literature searching process
- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the landscape of scholarly publishing

Skills and abilities

- demonstrate ability to define an information need and to formulate an adequate search strategy for a chosen research question
- demonstrate skills to effectively search publications in chosen databases from a selfformulated search strategy

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate ability to make a relevant selection among retrieved publications based on established criteria
- demonstrate ability to select one or several journals for their own publication and motivate the choice
 on the basis of the selection criteria treated in the course and be able to evaluate them by using
 appropriate indicators.

- Literature review types
- The literature searching process
- Bibliographic databases
- Development of scholarly communication
- Peer review
- Bibliometric indicators
- Publication strategy

Type of instruction

The teaching consists of lectures, workshops and exercises.

Language of instruction is in English.

Entry requirements

The applicant must be admitted to the third-cycle programme at The School of Education and Communication.

Examination and grades

The course is graded Pass (G) or Fail (U).

The examination is based on written examination and active participation during assignment seminars.
