



Indicated family support – a study of support to families having children with mild intellectual disabilities and the relation to child participation in everyday activities

Families having children with mild intellectual disability use less services in comparison to other families having children with disabilities and the children may have participation restrictions in everyday activities. It might have several explanations related to the families, that the laws require families to apply for services and that reach-out services are not provided. The aim of the study is, first to investigate the families service utilization and it's relation to children's participation, and second to investigate the effects of training professionals in how to provide support to the families. Family utilization of services are followed and children and families are interviewed twice within a two year period.
