

Background and aims

- Dual-continuum model of mental health problems and well-being (Keyes)
- Participation are likely related to well-being and possibly mental health problems
- This study aims to contribute to the understanding of how participation in school, family, and other life domains predict mental health problems and well-being and how these prediction models differ across disabilities



Design

- Registry data from two linked Swedish registries with repeated cross-sectional designs
 - Statistics Sweden Survey of Children's Living Conditions (Barn-ULF)
 - Statistics Sweden Survey of Living Conditions (ULF).
- 4305 children aged 12-18 years
- Divided into disability groups (min 100 in each group) based on parent rating of disability:
 - No disability
 - ADHD/autism
 - Specific language disorders (dyslexia and dyscalculia)
 - Asthma/allergy
 - Other disabilities
- Mental health problems as a one factor construct with several indicators
- Well-being as a one factor construct with several indicators



Analyses

- 28 predictor variables related to participation, background factors, and other things that potentially could be related to mental health problems and well-being
- Lasso regression analyses separate for mental health problems and well-being, and disability group (2x5=10 analyses)



Overall pattern of results

- Explained variance was generally low for all models, mean 25 [16-35]%
- Most predictors were of similar magnitude across all groups...
- ... but most predictors zero in the models

Conclusions

- No strong support for a dual-continuum model
- Participation as attendance not important, but having a close friend in school was important for the ADHD/autism group
- Limitations of parent ratings and low explained variance
