Everyday life with Inspera - from the perspective of an Academic

It is morning fika time, we are sitting down at a Swedish café with the JIBS profile, Adele Berndt, PHD, and Associate professor in Business Administration.

Adele works with bachelor- and master students in Marketing Management, Foundations of Marketing and Research and also with Consumer Behavior at the School of Engineering. She was also awarded the Jönköping University Pedagogical Prize in 2020.



Adele has always been curious about new technology and believes that it is important to test and evaluate new tools and services, online and otherwise. As she puts it:

- "Don't knock it until you've tried it".

At the very least, she gains some new insights about the tool itself and what the students in general meet in their daily lives.

A long-time user of Inspera, almost since the inception of Inspera at JU, Adele has seen the development and improvement of Inspera over time and is impressed with the rapid and positive changes in the platform.

- "It's almost a different tool now", Adele says. "I use Inspera for all of my exams, both on- and off-campus exams."

When discussing the greatest advantages of using Inspera, Adele points out that the grading process offers huge time-saving benefits as well as it all is taking place digitally.

- "There's no longer a risk of losing an exam paper at a public spot! We've all heard the horror stories!", she says with a laugh.

Another benefit is that grading can be done collaboratively on the same candidate, regardless of location. A team member can be sitting at home while another can be at his or her office at JU. The grading team can also discuss the grading of a candidate while inside the platform, and also easily divide up and assign the questions to a specific grader.

This has been a huge positive advantage when using digital assessment rather than grading on paper. Automatic grading has been a great time-saver as well, but Adele points out that you have to be pedagogically mindful when creating the questions.

When it comes to improvements in Inspera, Adele would love a proper filing system for sorting questions and was delighted to hear that such a system is indeed coming to Inspera during the Spring of 2023. Another upcoming improvement to Inspera that she thought was very interesting is the Rubrics module (featured on page four in this very newsletter). She believes that Rubrics will further clarify the feedback to the students as to what level of understanding the student has acquired.

We were also interested in why she often chooses to give off-campus exams where the students have 48 hours to complete their exams, particularly for Master students.

- "It is not always helpful to do closed-book exams. It does not always show the true knowledge and understanding of the subject. Sometimes the off-campus exams promote more learning in itself."

Even when offering three-hour on-campus exams, she sometimes permits certain aids such as course material and documents and other notes to be used during the exam. One specific feature she often uses and likes is the possibility of uploading stimulus for each question such as case studies, images and other documents.

A much appreciated and needed tool in Inspera is the anti-plagiarism tool Ouriginal which Adele believes is an absolute must when working with open-book exams.

When asking Adele about what would be her recommendations regarding E-assessment for new JU staff, she enthusiastically declares:

- "Try it, it's worth trying, dare to try! You will get help and handholding from the Inspera-team. We are all time-poor, we need to get the help we can from technology!"



Rubrics in Inspera

As spring approaches, Inspera will release the long-coveted teacher functionality in forms of Rubric assessments. This new functionality will be part of the manually marked question types in the present day Author module.

When the rubrics functionality is available in Inspera, you will find it under *Author > Rubrics*.

In summary - how it works

When creating your questions, the choice is made to use Rubrics as assessment instead of marks. You may either create a new Rubrics matrix for your question or use a pre-created template of choice.

The workspace in rubrics is easy to use - by just simply adding criteria or levels and thus expanding your assessment matrix. You may work with either point-based ranges, point ranges or percentage ranges.

Launch date

We are expecting the rubrics functionality to be released in February 2023 (we make reservations for delays that might occur).

It will be activated for all academics as soons as it is available.

In February we will also start up part 3 training sessions, where we will present Rubrics and other useful tools in Inspera (these sessions are listed under *Training sessions for the spring semester* on the last page).



That Course Coordinators and Examiners are eligible of viewing the identity of all candidates their pseudonymous ID. This view is found in Ladok under the *Activity Sessions* menu, i.e. when the exam has been confirmed in Inspera.

- 1. Click on *Activity Sessions* in the upper menu
- 2. Enter the course code and click on Search
- 3. Click the *Certify* tab
- 4. Make sure to tick both *Marked* as ready and *Certified* in the box

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• Click in any white area and the view will appear in green; civic number, name and pseudonymous Code (called Anonymous Code in Ladok)
