CEnSE is a multi-disciplinary institute that performs applied research relating to issues of entrepreneurship and business renewal, regional development and growth, and the interrelation between urban and rural areas. We address policy relevant problems, such as how accessibility affects regional growth and the way entrepreneurial and innovative processes in business and society are dependent on knowledge and creativity.

CEnSE is an international research milieu where all our activities such as seminars, workshops and daily communication are held in English.

We are a leading knowledge hub for industry, organizations, and governments — on both a national and international level. Since CEnSE was set up in 2010, we have been actively carrying out policy-relevant research in projects such as the EU Rural Development Programme, advising on infrastructure projects such as the high-speed railway project and regional development issues such as regional innovation systems.
