## Cultural encounters and cultural influences, 5 point

## Purpose

The course shall

- Create awareness of ones own culture, attitudes and values and their impact on behaviour and how living conditions affect our attitudes;
- Give a historical overview of migration and politics refugee issues;
- Allow students to develop their knowledge of cultural and linguistic diversity, cultural encounters (possibilities and problems) and social psychological aspects of these issues;
- Give competence to live and work in a multicultural society.

#### The nature of instruction

Introductory lectures, theory studies, project work in groups, role play, simulations, discussions, field studies, interviews with immigrants. Attendance is compulsory at all scheduled activities.

## Examination and grading

A student may either Fail or Pass the course. No other grades are given. Please note that these grades will *also* be given to foreign students even though their grading systems are likely to differ. No exceptions from this rule will be made until the course as such is included in the SOCRATES ECTS-scheme, which is currently not the case.

The content, structure, and didactic dimensions of the course presuppose active participation in all course activities. For a Pass grade on the course, attendance at all scheduled activities is required, as well as a Pass grade on all oral and written assignments.

Students account for their acquired knowledge and experience from their study of theories and field experiences in concluding seminars. Cross group presentations and seminars as well as written reflections will be used.
