



Communicating Nations

10 ECTS credits

The course includes elements such as ideas of nationhood and the ways that the media is involved in their creation, maintenance, and dissemination, reflection on the meanings ascribed to nationhood, the historical evolution of the ideas of nationhood within local, national, and global contexts. Representations of nationhood in the media. Different ways political and social groups use these different media outlets to tell their story. The place of nation and its role in the contemporary media landscape. The role of nationhood in a global and changing workplace.

PREREQUISITES

- 30 credits first cycle courses in any educational area
- Fluency in English equivalent to at least 575 (paper based test) or 90 (internet based test) TOEFL score (or equivalent)

Global Perspectives on Health and Welfare

10 ECTS credits

The aim of the course is to provide knowledge and understanding of the global situation related to health and welfare. Some of the elements included are the UN Sustainable Development Goals in relation to health and welfare, cultural aspects, complexity and impact of social determinants of health in different countries, international classification on functioning disability and health (ICF), perspectives on health and welfare in community development and more.

PREREQUISITES

- 30 credits first cycle courses in any educational area
- Fluency in English equivalent to at least 575 (paper based test) or 90 (internet based test) TOEFL score (or equivalent)

Purchasing Logistics with a Global Perspective

10 ECTS credits

The aim of the course is to give advanced knowledge of logistics in purchasing and supply chain management with a global perspective. The focus is on the purchasing functions importance of the company result, including elements such as supplier relations & portfolio, globalization, sustainability and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), legal aspects, performance measurements (KPIs) among others.

PREREQUISITES

- 60 credits first cycle courses in industrial engineering or business administration or computer information systems or equivalent
- Fluency in English equivalent to at least 575 (paper based test) or 90 (internet based test) TOEFL score (or equivalent)

PREREQUISITES

High School Diploma and English language skills corresponding to: IELTS 6.0 (no part below 5.5) or equivalent. Internet based TOEFL test 80, written test 21 or equivalent. Paper based TOEFL 550, written test 4.5 or equivalent.
