### Type of instruction

## Prerequisites

General entrance requirements.

Fluency in English equivalent to at least a 575 (paper-based scale) or 90 (internet-based scale) TOEFL score. IELTS: with an overall band score of 6.5 and no part below 5.5. Competency in Swedish language is not required (or the equivalent).

## Examination and grades

The course is graded A, B, C, D, E, FX or F.

Written individual examination at the end of the course of both parts of the course. Compulsory attendance.

The grade is translated to the ECTS grading scale (A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F).
